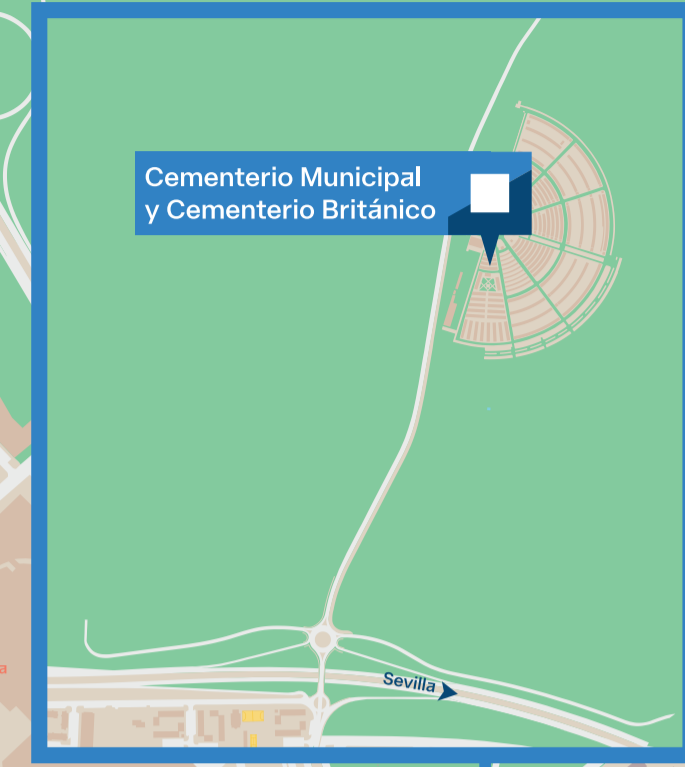

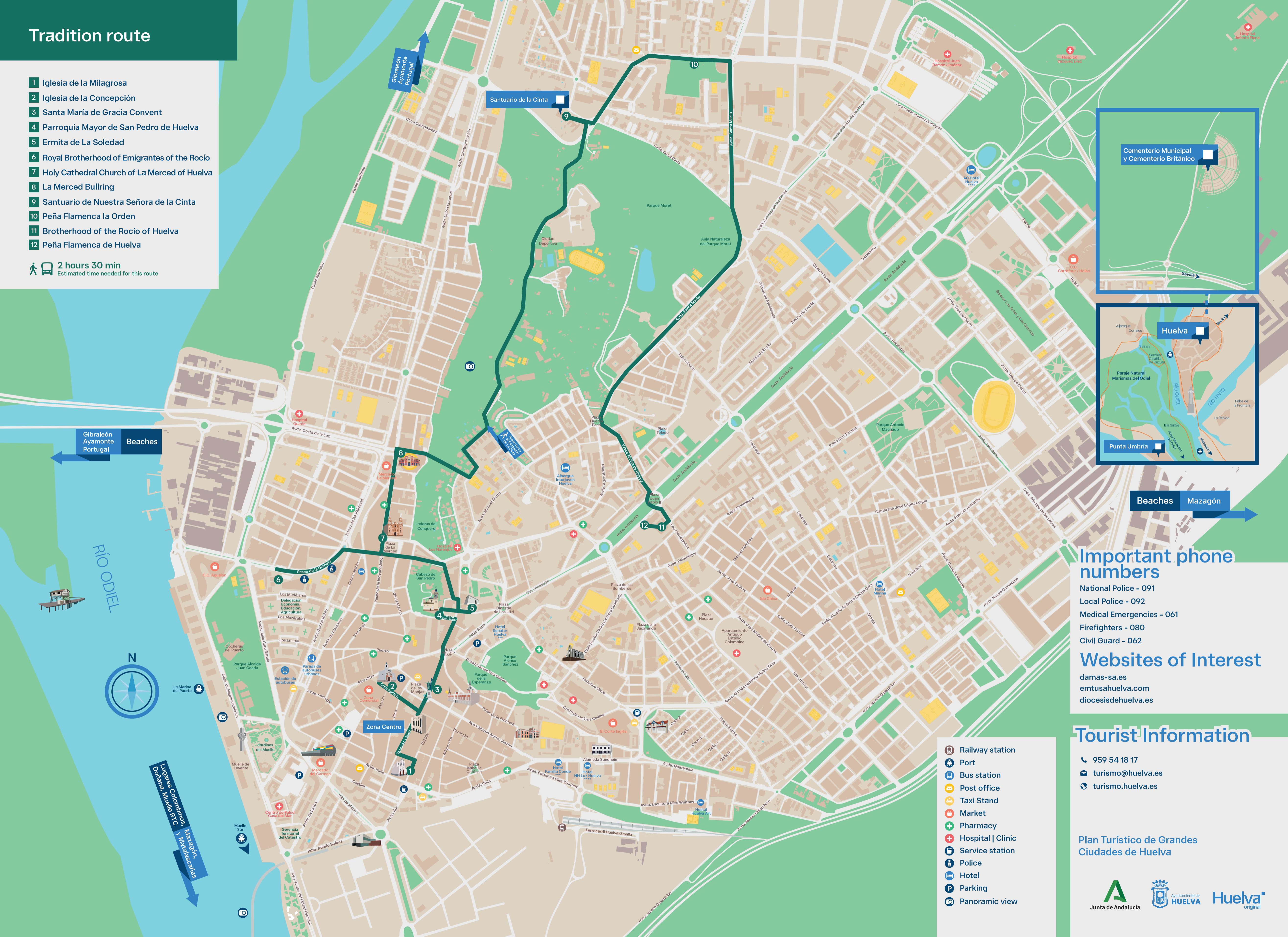

Throughout this route, you'll explore churches filled with history, such as the St Peter Main Parish Church, places of celebration and worship such as the sites of some of our brotherhoods and the Sanctuary of Our Lady of the Ribbon, as well as places where people meet and have fun together such as some of our flamenco clubs.

You'll marvel at the architecture and history you find at each one of the traditional legacy sites with different tastes, beliefs, customs, art... Live and feel the essence of Huelva through this Huelva Original Traditions tourist route.



1 Iglesia de la Milagrosa

This Neo-Gothic church in Huelva was built between 1923 and 1929. It stands out for its Gothic architecture, stained glass windows and the image of Our Lady, Star of the Sea. Although it has been subject of several reconstruction projects, the facade features Gothic elements.

4 Parroquia Mayor de San Pedro de Huelva

In a Gothic-Mudejar style, it dates back to the 14th century and is located on a historic hill. Built over the remains of a mosque, the architecture features Sevillian influences and stands out due to the artistic chapels and chevet. It is an important place of worship and heritage.

2 Iglesia de la Concepción

La Purísima Concepción parish church was built at the wishes of Cristobal Dorantes, a former ruler of the Villa of Huelva and member of one of the most powerful families of Huelva's social oligarchy in the first quarter of the 16th century.

It has been declared a Site of Cultural Interest under the Monument category.

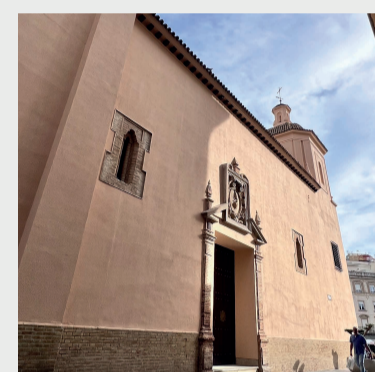

5 Ermita de La Soledad

Located in the historic neighbourhood of San Sebastian in Huelva, the Chapel of Solitude is a building of uncertain origin possibly dating back to the 18th century. Its history is associated with the Order of Saint James and the Christian conquest in the 13th century. It is currently home to the Santo Entierro (Holy Burial) brotherhood and is part of the city's religious heritage.

3 Santa María de Gracia Convent

The Santa María de Gracia (Holy Mary of Grace) convent is found on one side of the centrally-located square Plaza de las Monjas, where there was once an Arabian necropolis. On 25 March 1510, the sisters began their cloistered life under the protection of Ms Elvira de Guzmán y Maldonado, the Countess of Niebla.

6 Royal Brotherhood of Emigrantes of the Rocío

Founded in Germany in the 1960s, it honours the Virgin of the Rocío. Declared to be of "Public Interest", it has had its own headquarters and a temple in Molino de la Vega since 1998 as a reflection of its devotion and deeply-rooted Virgin of the Rocío spirit in the city.

10 Peña Flamenca la Orden

This club is a flamenco reference in Huelva. Established in 1972, it promotes and disseminates this art through performances, contests and cultural events. Its headquarters is a place where flamenco enthusiasts can enjoy and support local and international artists.

11 Brotherhood of the Rocío de Huelva

The Royal and Distinguished Brotherhood of Our Lady of Rocío de Huelva is a religious community which was founded in 1962 in devotion to the Virgin of Rocío. It participates in the annual pilgrimage to the village of Almonte. Its headquarters hosts key events such as the Triduum, the new brother induction ceremony, and the inauguration of the Master and Governing Board.

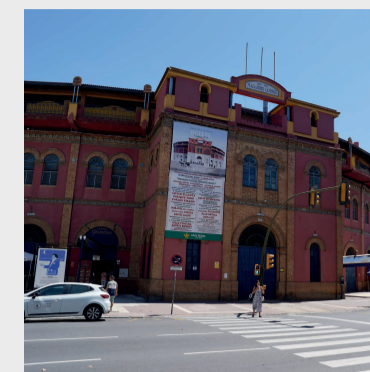

7 Santa Iglesia Catedral de la Merced

La Santa Iglesia Catedral de la Merced de Huelva, construida desde 1605 en estilo Barroco con influencias renacentistas y coloniales, tiene su origen en una capilla conventual mercedaria. Atribuída a Juan de Valdevira o fray Juan de Santamaría, refleja una rica historia religiosa desde alrededor de 1615.

8 La Merced Bullring

The Plaza de Toros La Merced, S.A. is an iconic bullfighting arena in Huelva, with more than a century of history. Located in the centre of the city, it offers exciting bullfights and related events as an emblematic site for bullfighting enthusiasts and those who love the local culture.

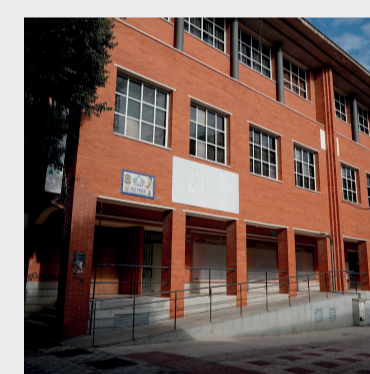

9 Santuario Diocesano de Ntra. Sra. de la Cinta

The Diocesan Sanctuary of Ntra. Sra. de la Cinta, the patroness saint of Huelva, is associated with the history of the Discovery of the Americas. Located on a unique hill, this 15th century Gothic-Mudejar building houses an 18th century altarpiece and a wood carving of the Virgin Mary. Columbus promised to pray in this Sanctuary, if they reached their destination.

12 Peña Flamenca de Huelva

This club is an important place for flamenco enthusiasts in the city. Founded as a cultural entity in 1966, it hosts flamenco events and performances as a way to promote and preserve this traditional art. Its headquarters is a meeting point for artists and fans.

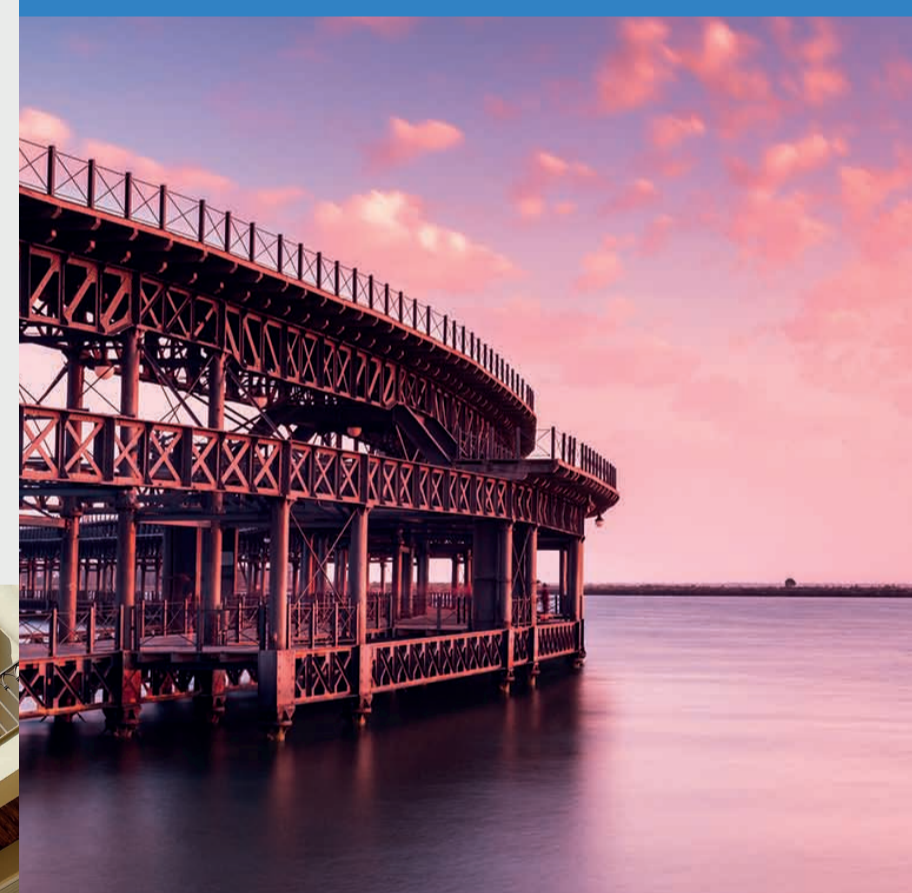
