Fuente de las Naciones (Fountain of the Nations) Paseo de la Ría

At the end of **Paseo de la Ría**, the Fountain of Nations is one of the city's historical identity marks.

This reconstruction of the old Fountain (Bank) of the American Nations featuring a drinking water fountain is a place of relaxation for the locals. It displays the Spanish coat of arms, as well as the coats of arms of ten American countries.



Santuario de la Cinta Avda, Manuel Siurot

The home of the city's patroness saint, Columbus prayed here following his first voyage to give thanks for the **success of the expedition.** The admiral and his mariners feared for their lives while facing a fierce ocean on their return. Columbus had promised to pray in this sanctuary if they arrived at their destination safely.

Bust of Inca Garcilaso

Columbus House Gardens

A Peruvian chronicler of Spanish descendance. He's considered to be **the first mestizo from the Americas in Spain.** His bust symbolizes Spain's mixed heritage with the people from the Americas.





Monument to Alonso Sánchez de Huelva

Jardines del Muelle, s/n

This work by León Ortega is located behind the Port Authority building. This mariner and merchant was born in Huelva in the mid-15th century. According to tradition, he reached the Americas before Christopher Columbus did in 1492. Therefore, he's known as the **"Prenaut"**.

Christopher Columbus Monument Plaza de las Monjas (Nun Square)

Inaugurated in 2011, it represents the Genovese navigator with a flag in one hand looking towards the sea, symbolizing his connection to the Discovery of the Americas.

Located in Plaza de las Monjas, this work by Rodríguez Picón pays homage to Columbus and Huelva as the origin of this discovery.
